Kia Ora Buckland School Whanau and Community Members

- I hope you all had a lovely long weekend and enjoyed being able to reconnect with family and friends. Thank you for the way you are dropping off your children in the mornings and picking them up at the allocated times in the afternoon. Morning Drop offs -Under Alert Level 2 we will continue with the drop offs being as close to 8.55 a.m. as possible and no earlier than 8.30a.m. (Unless arrangement has been made with principal.) Children must enter at either of the two George Crescent gates. Parents, unfortunately you will not be able to enter the school except in extreme cases. Teachers will continue to be out the front to welcome your children. Children will make their way straight to their classrooms, sanitize hands, and will have activities to occupy them prior to the start of the school day.
- ◆ Afternoon Staggered Pickups 2.30p.m. for Piwakawaka plus older siblings., 2.40p.m. for Titipounamu and Ruru and older siblings, 2.50p.m. for Yr 3 & 4, (plus siblings) 3.00p.m. for rest of children. We would like all children to have left by 3.15p.m. The patrolled crossing will operate.
- Adult Visits to School—If you absolutely need to visit the school you must do so through the office. We will only be allowing one person into the office at a time and you will be required to wait behind the red line until you are invited in. You will be required to sign in and record where you have come from and where you are going to. You will need to confirm that you are well and have no COVID-19 symptoms and have not been in contact with anyone who has the virus. This is a requirement under Alert Level 2.
- Soap & hand sanitizer—with the increase in use of these items some children's hands are getting sore. If this is the case for your child please do not hesitate to send their own soap or sanitizer with them to use at school.

- Alert Level 2 Guidelines for our school—these are on our website in the COVID-19 folder. If you have any queries/questions please phone me.
- BOOK Amnesty—We still have a large number of Library and Reading books that have not been returned. Please return these. Library books and journals that show they have been withdrawn do not need to be returned—they are yours to keep.

- Chickens for Agricultural Day—if you would like to order a chicken to rear for this year's Agricultural Day please use the order form in this newsletter. All chickens must be ordered through our school for uniformity of judging. It is best to order more than one chicken to allow for mishaps. This year there is only one hatch date available— Tuesday 7 July. Families who order chickens will need to be available to collect them from the school on this day, (the first Tuesday of the July school holidays - time to be confirmed). The cost for each chicken is \$5.00. Your order and payment can be given to your classroom teacher who will pass it on.
- The 2020 Kiwi Competitions: for any Year 5—8 students who would like to participate in Mathematics, English or Science have been postponed until the first three weeks of Term 3 this year. They will open from the 22nd July to 12th August. The Kiwi Competition registration deadline has been extended to Friday 5th June therefore we will need to have any registrations in by this Wed 3 June. If your child is interested the cost for each paper is \$9.00. Please email principal@buckland.school.nz and I will give your child the entry form.
