- ◆ Dogs in our Playground—We are happy for our school to be used and enjoyed by our community, however recently we have been left with cleaning up dog poo on the field and in our playgrounds, as well as off children's feet! If you are a dog owner who visits the school please be responsible and respectful of our facilities and carry a bag to collect any droppings.
- **Before and After School Requirements:** We are happy to assist parents with work commitments in the mornings from 8—8.30a.m. but please be mindful that this is a busy time for staff as well and therefore children who arrive early must behave themselves, sit in front of Kea & Piwakawaka and talk quietly. At this time computers and the playground are not to be used. Parents of children who can't abide by the rules will be contacted to drop children off after 8.30a.m. After school, children must also wait on the seats out front until parents arrive, preschoolers may use the playground but not school students. If you arrive and want children on the playground you are welcome to supervise them on the senior playground.

The school will be open on that day but with fewer staff than usual for the afternoon session.
